7 By the Amity you will have the goodness to transmit for the Botanic Gardens here. a few cases or Casks of Earth, from the most remote or unfrequented part of your Command, and to be taken within 12 inches from the Surface.

8. At the same time if not already done by the Am, you will not fail to forward Returns in the various prescribed Forms, completed to the end of the Year, taking care the dates and other particulars are accurately inserted, to which I regret to observe, the proper attention does not appear, to have been paid in some cases. - The Amity will remain at Melville Island, but the Mermaid will convey hither, your Dispatches. Should any other opportunity however occur in the interim, it will be well to avail yourself of it, to send Duplicates.

9. I take this opportunity of transmitting for your information and guidance, a Copy of the Acts in Council, Government notes &c issued during the latter half of the year 1826.
